

Five Properties

1. Displacemenet

is at work when we talk about people, things, or ideas which are not presently happening around us. This flexibility is highly distinctive of human language. Most other animals are only capable of creating call sounds in response to present stimuli—food, danger, or a desire to mate, for instance. As humans, we can say things like, "I wonder what I'll have for dinner later," even if we are not presently hungry.

2. Open - Endness

Language is the dress of thought Dr Samuel Johnson 18th Century English Writer

3. Arbitrariness

acknowledges that the words we speak, gestures we make, and markings we use in writing do not really represent what we are talking about. For example, the word "apple" is not really an apple, just a word we have assigned for discussing the fruit. There is an exception to this in speaking, though: onomatopoeic sounds-like crash, bang, and plop-directly mimick an actual sound.

English has 26 letters and 44 sound which helps create many more words. Language has grammar system through which the speakers can create new sentence of past, present and future and of any scenario

4. Cultural Transmission it includes Painting, Art, Architecture, and Religion

5. Dymanic Creature

It has changes through times. USA and UK have the same language but are two different countries. Like wise Hindi has also changed from Ancient time and now Language might have creates 5 or 6 millions of years ago. Africa as Cradle of mankind

Theories of the origins of Language

- The bow-bow theory: based upon the notion that speech arose through people imitating the sounds of environment, especially animal calls, the use of onomatopoeic words
- The pooh-pooh theory: based on the evidence that speech arose through people making instinctive sounds
- The ding-dong theory: postulates that speech arose because people reacted to the world around them, sound symbolism

The oral-gesture source

- The "oral-gesture theory" proposes an extremely specific connection between physical and oral gesture. It is claimed that originally a set of physical gestures was developed as a means of communication. It is proposed by Sir Richard Paget (1930)
- Then a set of oral gestures, specifically involving the mouth, developed, in which the movements of the tongue, lips and so on were recognized according to patterns of movement similar to physical gestures.

LANGUAGES
